Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)
Inviting Applications for the Community Development
Block Grant (CDBG) Program for Fiscal Year 2026-2027**

APPLICATIONS DUE FEBRUARY 27, 2026

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to the City of Newport Beach for projects that provide decent housing, suitable living environments, and expanded economic opportunities, particularly for low- and moderate-income people. The City anticipates receiving an allocation of approximately \$402,000 and may use up to 15% of the allocation to provide public services.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Newport Beach is currently accepting funding applications from non-profit organizations to provide public services to low- and moderate-income residents. Services should meet City of Newport Beach's Consolidated Plan priorities. Organizations should have the capacity to implement programs in accordance with the requirements established by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), including applicable Executive Orders. ELIGIBLE APPLICATIONS: Applications must demonstrate that the service to be provided will principally benefit persons of low- and moderate-income (households earning less than 80% of Orange County's median income). Examples of eligible services include housing and/or support programs for victims of domestic violence, abused children/youth, the disabled, seniors, or the homeless. Additionally, services addressing unemployment, inadequate healthcare, crime prevention, or substance abuse rehabilitation are eligible. All programs must benefit persons of low-to-moderate-income as defined by the CDBG program. Applications will also be accepted from organizations seeking to provide fair housing and landlord-tenant services in accordance with HUD requirements.

DEADLINE: Interested applicants must complete and submit an application, available at <http://www.newportbeachca.gov/CDBGapplication>. Applications will be accepted until **2:00 p.m. on Friday, February 27, 2026**, at the City of Newport Beach, Community Development Department located at 100 Civic Center Drive, Newport Beach, CA 92660.
