TITLE: Ordinance No. 2025-28: Amending Subsection B of Section

10.04.010 of Chapter 10.04 to define Possession of an Open

Container

ABSTRACT:

For the City Council's consideration is an amendment to Subsection B of Section 10.04.010 (Drinking in Public) of Chapter 10.04 (Intoxicating Liquor) of the Newport Beach Municipal Code (NBMC) related to the possession of alcoholic beverages. The proposed amendment would more clearly define possession of an open container. The proposed ordinance will update Chapter 10.04 of the Newport Beach Municipal Code. The ordinance was introduced for consideration at the City Council's September 23, 2025 regular meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- a) Determine this action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15060(c)(2) and 15060(c)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because this action will not result in a physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly; and
- b) Conduct a second reading and adopt Ordinance No. 2025-28: An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Newport Beach, California, Amending Section 10.04.010 (Drinking in Public) of Chapter 10.04 (Intoxicating Liquor) of the Newport Beach Municipal Code Related to the Possession of Alcoholic Beverages.

DISCUSSION:

At its September 23, 2025 meeting, the City Council introduced and passed to second reading Ordinance No. 2025-28. The ordinance would amend Subsection B of Section 10.04.010 (Drinking in Public) of Chapter 10.04 (Intoxicating Liquor) of the Newport Beach Municipal Code related to the possession of alcoholic beverages to further define possession of an open container. If adopted, the ordinance would become effective on November 13, 2025.

It is generally prohibited for any person to possess an open, partially consumed, or unsealed container of alcoholic beverage in or on public streets, sidewalks, alleys, restrooms, parking lots (public or private), beaches, piers (open to the public), parks, vacant lots, or private property visible to the public. Regulations for drinking in public are

defined currently under NBMC Section 10.04.010 (Drinking in Public). Specifically, Subsection B of Section 10.04.010 addresses possession of an open container of alcohol.

Police officers, most often while working beach enforcement, encounter individuals with open containers of alcohol on the sand next to them, or containers within their immediate reach and vicinity. The proposed amendments would clarify the term "possession" to include actual physical possession and constructive, joint or other types of possession, such as when an individual has control over or access to an open container of alcohol, even if not physically held.

To ensure clarity and consistency, the Police Department wishes to amend the definition of "possession" included in Subsection B of Section 10.04.010 for the purposes of enforcing the prohibition, including distinctions between actual, constructive, joint, and other types of possession of alcoholic beverages in public areas.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact related to this item.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW:

Staff recommends the City Council find this action is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15060(c)(2) (the activity will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment) and 15060(c)(3) (the activity is not a project as defined in Section 15378) of the CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, because it has no potential for resulting in physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly.
