- Three fire engines were sent to Fullerton and surrounding cities to help with the Fullerton airplane crash
- Mike Mullen and Edward Wick both retired in December 2024, both with over 30 years of service
- Interviews were recently held for department assistant and lifeguard officer
- Fire Santa Program was a success and raised over \$10,000 for a family
- Captain Prep Workshop was held for 20 inspiring captains with the promotional exam scheduled for February 2024
- C. POLICE DEPARTMENT MATTERS Jonathan Stafford, Deputy Director of Police Services

Deputy Director of Police Services Jonathan Stafford reported:

- Retirements
 - Chief Cartwright retired from his position of police chief
 - Timothy Stewart retired after 37 years
 - Lisa Newman retired after 34 years
- Deputy Chief Dave Miner is the acting chief of police
- Promotion and Swearing-In Ceremony
 - Held on Monday, December 9, 2024, with two Community Service Officers (CSO) promoted to Animal Control Officer and Civilian Investigator
 - Swore in five laterals and three CSO's
 - The next Promotion and Swearing-In Ceremony will be held on Monday, January 27, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. in the Community Room
- Hiring/Training Update
 - Four laterals and several recruits are in the hiring process
 - Six recruits are currently in the Orange County Sheriff's Academy
 - Two additional recruits have been hired and are awaiting academy in January
 - Six officers are in training in the Field Officer Training Program and one lateral is now working solo
- In December 2024, Computer Automated Dispatch (CAD) events totaled 7,066, a decrease from 8,151 CAD events in December 2023.
- Annual Crime Stats for 2024 (through December 29, 2024)
 - Total Crime was down 2.3 percent
 - Person Crimes were up one percent
 - Society Crimes were up by 25.2 percent
 - Largely due to proactive narcotics arrests (+269)
 - o Property Crime was down 13.2 percent, or 361 incidents
 - Significant decreases in burglary, theft/larceny, and vandalism

In response to Board Member Herzog's inquiry, Deputy Director of Police Services Jonathan Stafford stated it is too early to talk about trends regarding burglary but confirms there has been an increase in recent burglaries, which may be a result of burglary theft rings. New police technology initiatives are helping with identifying burglary suspects.
