A. CITY-WIDE AND HUMAN RESOURCES MATTERS – Sarah Rodriguez, Human Resources Manager

Human Resources Manager Sarah Rodriguez reported:

- Senior Human Resources Analysts Maritza Leon-Mis and Tosha Arellano attended the Liebert Cassidy Whitmore Public Sector Employment Law Annual Conference that was held on January 30 and January 31, 2025
- Human Resources Analyst Caroline Hua and Human Resources Specialist Rachel Weigand will be attending the annual Public Agency Risk Management Association Conference that will be held February 24 through February 26, 2025
- Open Recruitment

B. FIRE DEPARTMENT MATTERS – Adam Novak, Fire Battalion Chief

Fire Battalion Chief Adam Novak reported:

- Lifeguard Tryouts
 - Tryouts were held on January 25, 2025
 - There were 98 applications, 60 candidates, and 49 completing both events
 - 48 people passed the interview portion, and 47 candidates will proceed with the next steps

- Councilmembers Erik Weigand, Sara Weber, and Michelle Barto attended the tryout with Erik Weigand participating
- Interviews will be held the week of February 3, 2025
- Basic Lifeguard Academy will begin in March
- Junior lifeguard registration is now open
- Captain Natalie May and Lifeguard Officer Robert Marienthal completed 20 hours of Emergency Operations Center (EOC) training and disaster simulation with multiple other agencies in Seal Beach
- Orange County Regional training was conducted in San Clemente with 25 lifeguards from across the county.
- Lifeguard Officer Foster Hoose has completed six training dives in the last six weeks, including one night dive, and he will be available for Night Standby (NSB) duty moving forward
- Six classes of EMT/CPR training lifeguard staff taught in collaboration with Firefighters.

Fire Operations

- Statistics
 - Total Incidents: 1,207
 - Fires: 32Hazmat: 13
 - Emergency Medical Services: 876
 - Service Calls: 141
 - Other Emergencies: 141
- Hiring of Firefighter and Firefighter Paramedics
 - Firefighter closed with 585 applicants with one position available
 - Firefighter paramedic is still open
- o Fire captain promotional exam will take place at end of February 2025
- Strike Teams and Wildland Fires
 - 15 personnel and four apparatus to the Eden and Palisades fire with Fire Battalion Chief Adam Novak at Palisades Fire for 14 days
 - Wellness
 - Rotation to leave at seven days
 - Mental Health Counseling Team International debrief poststrike teams and pier incident
 - Medical evaluation at Hoag
 - This month the Newport Beach Fire Department (NBFD) will be speaking with many outlets including Wake Up Newport, Good Morning Corona Del Mar, Speak Up Newport, and Balboa Island discussing topics of wildland fire home hardening techniques, fuel modification, and insurance
 - The 2025/2026 fiscal year budget will be focused on vehicle and facility sustainability
 - Values book written in partnership with labor leaders and management members
 - The NBFD is partnering with the Newport Beach Police Department on the new drone program
 - David Gibson is heading the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program and the NBFD encouraging residents to enroll considering the recent Los Angeles fires

In response to Board Member Denner's question, Fire Battalion Chief Adam Novak shared no NBFD personnel were affected by the loss of a home with the fires in Los Angeles.

C. POLICE DEPARTMENT MATTERS – Jonathan Stafford, Deputy Director of Police Services

Deputy Director of Police Services Jonathan Stafford reported:

- Citizen's Academy begins February 26, 2025, at the Newport Beach Police Department with one councilmember and five city employees participating
- A Promotion and Swearing-In Ceremony was held on January 27, 2025, with three sergeants, one civilian investigator, one custody officer promoted and three lateral police officers, and one Community Service Officer (CSO) sworn in.
- Technology Updates
 - The Drone Program will go before the City Council on February 25, 2025
 - Fusus implantation has started and is expected to be available in about 45 days
 - The Flock Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) system has been installed and is in use
- Hiring/Training Update
 - One lateral has started work
 - o Three laterals and several recruits are in the hiring process
 - Seven recruits are in the Orange County Sheriff's Academy
 - The Field Training Officer (FTO) Program has six officers in training and two laterals have begun working solo
- In January 2025, Computer Automated Dispatch (CAD) events totaled 7,694, a decrease from 7,926 CAD events in January 2024
- Annual Department Statistics for 2024
 - Total phone calls handled in dispatch: 163,030 (including outgoing calls)
 - Total CAD events entered: 99,093
 - o Number of 911 calls answered: 37,596
 - Calls answered in 15 seconds: 99.84 percent
 - Calls answered in 10 seconds: 99.63 percent
 - Number of days with 100 percent of calls answered within 10 seconds: 277 (15 seconds is the state-wide standard)
 - Average response time for Priority 1 Call: 2:56
 (a decrease/improvement from 3:00 in 2023)
 - Average response time for Priority 2 Call: 5:53
 (a decrease/improvement from 6:04 in 2023)
 - o Total arrests: 3,220 (Average of 8.8 per day)
 - o Investigative clearance rate was 54.5 percent

In reply to Board Member Wood's inquiry, Deputy Director Stafford stated there was only a four-second differential in response time, on average, with no statistical significance or explanation for the improvement.
