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America 250 Plaque Dedication

A generous donation was made by the Newport Beach Foundation to have a plaque made and installed at John Wayne Park commemorating the United States of America's 250th Anniversary. The plaque was to be mounted next to the existing Bicentennial plaque, which was recast as well due to wear and tear. Both plaques were mounted onto a new pedestal created by staff. The landscape around the dedication area was refreshed and patriotic annual color was added. The result is a beautiful display commemorating the birth of a nation.





Special Tree Removal at 301 Seaward Road

On June 3, 2026, Municipal Operations Department staff and contractors responded to a Special Neighborhood City Coral tree at 301 Seaward Road that suffered a trunk failure due to internal decay. The City contractor performed an emergency removal of the remaining Special Coral (*Erythrina caffra*) tree. The tree will be replaced with another Coral tree.



Special Tree Removal at 1829 Glenwood Lane

An emergency removal of a Special City Lemon-Scented Gum Eucalyptus (*Corymbia citriodora*) located at 1829 Glenwood Lane was deemed necessary following a field inspection, where it was determined that severe root loss and root pruning would be needed for necessary concrete work. Therefore, the tree would be disturbed, and the stability of the tree could be jeopardized and create a high potential for tree failure. Repairs were to occur both at the immediately adjacent sidewalk as well as the immediate adjacent curb and gutter simultaneously. The severity of the tripping hazard necessitated the use of the emergency provisions of the City Council Policy G-1. The City will replace the Special City tree with a 36-inch box tree in the same location.



Trees Maintenance

During the month of June, Great Scott Tree Service (GSTS) trimmed citywide Palms, citywide Corals, Broadleaf trees in Grid 4, (Spyglass), Grid 20 (Pelican Crest) and responded to six tree-related emergencies, plus completed five service requests.
