A. CITY-WIDE AND HUMAN RESOURCES MATTERS – Natalie Asato, Human Resources Analyst

Human Resources Analyst Natalie Asato reported:

- Human Resources is currently recruiting for two human resources specialists
- Human Resources recently welcomed a new intern, Alyssa Cruz
- University of California Irvine College Intern Daniel Kim will begin August 6, 2024;
 he will be spending five weeks gaining experience in a variety of human resources and risk management functions
- Employee Training Opportunities
 - Customer Service Training will be held on August 14, 2024
 - o Editing and Proofreading Emails will be held on August 29, 2024
- Open Recruitment
 - Full Time: Department Assistant, Deputy City Attorney, Engineering Technician, Human Resources Specialist, Librarian III, Management Analyst, Planning Technician, Police Animal Control Officer, Police Community Services Officer – FT/PT, Police Dispatcher, Police Officer – Lateral, Police Officer – Recruit & Academy Graduate/Academy Enrolled, Senior Fiscal Clerk, Utilities Specialist

B. FIRE DEPARTMENT MATTERS - Justin Carr, Assistant Fire Chief

Assistant Fire Chief Justin Carr reported:

- Fourth of July weekend (07/04/2024 07/07/2024) had 807 rescues, 30 medical aids, and 12,423 prevents
- July 6th was the 10th Anniversary of Ben Carlson's Last Rescue

- Officer Marienthal and Lifeguard Jose Cueto responded to a mutual aid request in Huntington Beach for a late-night missing swimmer a week ago, where the swimmer was later found deceased
- Gray Lunde Ironman had its biggest event that included 250 participants with the junior lifeguards
- The Ben Carlson Foundation hosted an adult pier jump and raised over \$25,000
- Over 1,200 junior lifeguards participated in the Monster Mile

Fire Operations

- Fourth of July weekend was one of the busiest on record for the Newport Beach Fire Department
 - One notable incident involved an altercation between four people that ended with three people being cut by a knife. A Newport Beach police officer arrived on the scene and quickly applied tourniquets to both affected legs of one patient, saving his life
- July Deployments
 - Two type I engines with different strike teams (Park Fire in Chico)
 - One line Emergency Medical Technician Paramedic (EMTP) Lake Fire
 - One Field Observer (FOBS) Lake Fire
 - Two Safety Officers (SOFRs) Park Fire
 - One type III engines Nixon Fire
 - One Task Force Leader (TFLD) Park Fire
- Chief Boyles participated in the motorhome madness at the Orange County Fair along with Council Members Blom, Weigand, and Stapleton, and Assistant Chief of Lifeguards Brian O'Rourke, and retired Police Chief Jon Lewis
- Seven firefighters are currently in the background phase of the hiring process

In response to Chair Meyer's inquiry, Assistant Fire Chief Justin Carr stated new hires are applying for open positions both laterally and fresh out of fire school.

C. POLICE DEPARTMENT MATTERS – Jonathan Stafford, Deputy Director of Police Services

Deputy Director of Police Services Jonathan Stafford reported:

- Fourth of July
 - Fourth of July was fairly uneventful
 - There was a fight resulting in a stabbing on the 2300 block of West Balboa
 - For the 24-hour period from 8:00 a.m. July 4th to 8:00 a.m. July 5th, there were 28 arrests (compared to 33 in 2023) and 722 Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) events (compared to 751 in 2023)
- Staffing and Systems for the new Crime Information Center (CIC)
 - o Civilian investigator openings are coming soon
 - Flock procurement passed City Council on July 9, 2024, with contract finalizations and hopes of beginning installation in the next few weeks
 - Fusus intelligence platform will be on the August 27, 2024, City Council agenda

- Teen Academy graduation was held on July 31, 2024
- Hiring/Training Update
 - o Three recruits graduated from the Sheriff's Academy in July
 - Several more laterals and several recruits are in the final hiring stages
 - Two recruits are in the Orange County Sheriff's Academy (OCSA)
 - o Two recruits have been hired and are awaiting the academy
 - Four recruits and one lateral are in training in the Field Training Officer (FTO) program
- In July 2024, CAD events totaled 10,138, a very slight decrease compared to 10,240 CAD events in July 2023.
- Crime Statistics through July 31, 2024, using National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) methodology
 - o Person offenses were up 7.6 percent
 - Property offenses were down by 13.4 percent (199 crimes)
 - Society offenses were up 12 percent, but are heavily influenced by proactive narcotics arrests (598 of 687 crimes in this category are narcotics arrests [87%])
