## Comparison of Tobacco Regulations in other cities

City	Permit Requirement	Regulations
Orange	Ministerial: Tobacco Retailer Permit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Location Regulations: 500 ft. from another permitted tobacco retailer and a sensitive use, including, but not limited to: schools (public or private, preschool, K-12), libraries, parks, playgrounds, recreational facilities, daycare centers, healthcare facilities, elder care facilities, houses of worship, or other youth-oriented locations.</li> <li>Population Cap Limit: 2,500-person limit per tobacco retailer permit.</li> </ul>
Anaheim	Ministerial: Tobacco Retailer Permit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Location Regulations: 500 ft. from another permitted tobacco retailer. 1,000 feet from sensitive receptors, including but not limited to, schools, community centers, parks, libraries, or any mental health facilities.</li> </ul>
Buena Park	Ministerial: Tobacco Retailer License	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Location Regulations: 500 feet of any public or private school (K-12), public library, or public park.</li> </ul>
Costa Mesa	Ministerial: Business License	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Location Regulations: 1,000 feet of a public or private primary or secondary educational school facility.</li> </ul>
Beverly Hills	Prohibited	Prohibition on the retail sale of tobacco products and electronic cigarette paraphernalia. Prohibition applies to most retailers (gas stations, pharmacies, groceries); permanent exemptions for 3 existing cigar lounges and limited hotel-guest sales.
