CHALLENGE

Meeting maintenance dredging needs vs. ecological importance (regulatory requirements)

"Newport Specific Plan"


 Temporary eelgrass impacts while maintenance dredging via the City's "RGP-54" dredging permit

RGP 54 Dredging Permit

Eelgrass	Temporary impacts permitted under the City's Eelgrass Plan
Sediment testing	Periodic harbor-wide characterization (5 years)
Maximum dredge depth	Maximum of -10 ft MLLW plus 2 ft. over-depth
Individual project volume limit	8,000 cy
Annual maximum volume	75,000 cubic yards (cy)



Eelgrass (*Zostera marina*)





- Unique flowering plant adapted to living underwater
- Dense meadows in shallow bays and estuaries
- Shallow and deep water varieties



Eelgrass Regulatory Requirements

- Considered a sensitive resource
- National Marine Fisheries Service (federal) leads when impacts are proposed
- California Eelgrass Mitigation Plan (CEMP)
 - Default plan for California
 - Impacts = 1.38:1 mitigation
- "Newport Specific Plan"
 - Temporary impacts allowed based on overall eelgrass population and distribution


















RGP 54 Program Summary

Year One (2016)

- 43 applications
 - 60,185 cubic yards dredged
 - 18 properties temporarily impacted eelgrass (0.51 acre,
 22,216 s/f)

Year Two (2017)

- 32 applications
 - 54,564 cubic yards dredged
 - 25 properties temporarily impacted eelgrass (0.97 acre,
 42,253 s/f)

RGP 54 Program to Date

Year Three (2018)

- 10 applications
 - 24,729 cubic yards dredged
 - 4 properties temporarily impacted eelgrass (0.60 acre,
 26,316 s/f)

Year Four (2019 January to March)

- **5** applications
 - Dredging planning underway
 - Eelgrass impact TBD

RGP 54 Amendment Request and Re-Authorization

- Omit requirement for pre-con Caulerpa Survey.
- Aligned dredging operations plan requirements between permits.
- Addressed inconsistencies in reporting requirements.
- Re-authorization to be filed in 2019 will include allowance for nearshore (ocean beaches) and carve out for unrestricted beach maintenance.
