TO: HONORABLE MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

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TITLE: Resolution No. 2021-52 Specifying Uses for FY 2021-22 RMRA
Funding from the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017

ABSTRACT:

Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 provides funding for the maintenance and repair of local streets and roads through a Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA). To be eligible for FY 2021-22 funding, the City of Newport Beach (City) must submit a project list to the California Transportation Commission (CTC) by July 1, 2021, along with a resolution documenting the approval of the City's project list.

RECOMMENDATION:

- a) Determine this action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15060(c)(2) and 15060(c)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because this action will not result in a physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly; and
- b) Adopt Resolution No. 2021-52, *A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Newport Beach, California, Adopting a List of Projects for Fiscal Year 2021-22 Funded by SB 1, The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.*

DISCUSSION:

The City receives transportation funding from the State of California in the form of grants or a direct allocation of Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax (Gas Tax) funds through the Highway Users Tax Account (HUTA). The Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (SB 1) is a newer funding program for California's transportation systems, approximating \$5 billion per year. It is estimated that the City will receive approximately \$1,647,859 in FY 2021-22 from RMRA funding.

To be eligible for this funding, the City must submit a proposed project list to the CTC by July 1, 2021, along with a resolution that identifies all proposed projects that may be funded with RMRA funding.

RMRA local streets and roads allocations must be used for projects that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Road maintenance and rehabilitation
- Safety projects
- Railroad grade separations
- Traffic control devices
- Complete street components, (including active transportation purposes, pedestrian and bicycle safety projects, transit facilities, and drainage and stormwater capture projects in conjunction with any other allowable project)
- Match requirement to obtain state or federal funds for eligible projects

Staff recommends the use of RMRA funding to partially fund the following project:

- (FY 2021-22) Jamboree Road Pavement Rehabilitation and Median Landscape Irrigation Improvements (21R15)

FISCAL IMPACT:

RMRA funding for the identified project is included in the FY 2021-22 proposed Capital Improvements Program (CIP) budget for the City Council's consideration.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW:

Staff recommends the City Council find this action is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Sections 15060(c)(2) (the activity will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment) and 15060(c)(3) (the activity is not a project as defined in Section 15378) of the CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, because it has no potential for resulting in physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly.
